Let this Directory remind you that the church has a very definite part to play in the scheme of things. A churchless community would be anything but a desirable place in which to live. The whole town benefits in countless ways when its churches are well and regularly attended.

As Baptists, we stand for a regenerate church membership. We baptize, as we believe the New Testament teaches, by immersion, upon profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord. Our chief emphasis is not upon baptism, but upon the soul's personal relationship to Jesus Christ. Until, however, the believer has symbolized that relationship in the ordinance of baptism, the right-hand of fellowship into the membership of the church cannot be given. "If ye love me," said our Saviour, "Keep my commandments." Baptism, symbolizing the believer's relationship to Christ in His death and resurrection, is certainly one of these commandments.

Church membership means a great deal more than a welcome and having one's name placed on the church roll. It involves each member's active interest in the work of the church, financial support, and continual prayer. It calls for loyalty in attendance at its services and loving fellowship with one's fellow-members. No true Christian can afford to neglect attendance at and participation in the Lord's Supper. "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this

cup, ye do show the Lord's death till he come."

Church membership calls for continual growth in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and daily Christian living before one's fellows. A true church member is careful not to grieve or quench the Holy Spirit. (See Ephesians 4:25-32 and 2 Thessalonians 5:15-23.)

Un-Christian living in word or deed brings reproach upon the cause of Christ and makes church membership a byword among those who do not see its value. "We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Let every one of us please his neighbour for his good to edification. For even Christ pleased not Himself."

Constitution of Simcoe Baptist Church

AS ADOPTED JANUARY 20, 1909

X

ARTICLE I-Reception of Members

Sec. 1. Any person professing faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, giving evidence of change of heart, and adopting the views of faith and practice held by this church, as set forth in the foregoing Declaration, may, upon baptism, be received into its membership.

Sec. 2. Candidates for baptism shall be examined before the church; and their admission shall not be acted upon until the church has ascertained their character and standing. It is desirable that the question of reception shall not be taken in their presence.

Sec. 3. Members from other churches holding the same faith may be received by letter of recommendation and

dismission from their respective churches.

Sec. 4. Those who have once been members of Baptist churches, and in consequence of any peculiar circumstances have no regular letters of dismission, may be received by giving satisfactory evidence of a change of heart, Christian conduct, and spiritual faith.

Sec. 5. Excluded members may be restored to membership on confession of their errors, and giving evidence

of repentance.

Sec. 6. No person shall be received as a member of this church to whose admission five members object.

ARTICLE II-General Duties of Members

Sec. 1. The duties of members to themselves are, the acquisition of scriptural knowledge; constant progress in spirituality; consistency of external conduct; and the con-

trol and eradication of every unholy temper.

Sec. 2. It is the duty of members to honor, esteem, and love their pastor; to pray for him, fervently and daily; to submit to him in the scriptural exercise of his official authority; to attend constantly upon his ministrations; to manifest a tender regard for his reputation; and to contribute towards his support in proportion to their ability.

Sec. 3. It is the duty of each member to cultivate and cherish brotherly love for all other members of the church; and to show this love by using all proper measures to pro-

mote their spiritual benefit and prosperity.

Sec. 4. Toward those who are not connected with this church, it is the duty of members to be exact in fulfilling obligations and performing promises; and as opportunity and ability may enable, to commend the Gospel of Christ unto them.

Sec. 5. It is the duty of all members removing from the vicinity of the church, to take letters of dismission to other churches of the same denomination; but should this not be practicable, to furnish their names and places of residence within three months of leaving the church.

ARTICLE III-Officers of the Church

Sec. 1. As often as it may be deemed necessary, by the death or removal of a previous pastor, the church shall, without unnecessary delay, invite to its pastorship some minister of good report; provided at least three-fourths of the members present and voting at any meeting, of which two weeks' public notice shall have been given, consent to the invitation.

It shall be the duty of the pastor to preach statedly at the church; to administer the ordinances of the Gospel; to act as moderator, when present, in meetings for the transaction of business; and to perform the various other duties

incumbent on his office.

Sec. 2. The church shall elect deacons by ballot with-

out nomination, at the annual business meeting.

Sec. 3. The management of the affairs of the church shall be vested in a board of managers, composed of the following: The pastor, 7 deacons, 3 trustees, treasurer, clerk, music and organ manager and supply manager. The deacons shall hold office for four years, and two deacons shall retire each year, except every fourth year, when one shall retire. (No deacon shall be eligible for re-election for one year—Adopted Jan. 4, 1911.) The vacancies occasioned by the retiring deacons shall be filled at the annual business meeting. The other officers shall hold office for one year, and shall be elected at the annual business meeting.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the deacons to seek out such members of the church as need pecuniary assistance, and to use the alms of the church for their relief; to visit the sick; to prepare and distribute the elements of the Lord's Supper; to take a general supervision of the temporal interests of the church, and to co-operate with and

assist the pastor in the performance of his duties.

Sec. 5. The trustees shall be the legal representatives

of the church.

Sec. 6. The treasurer shall receive from the financial secretary all moneys (other than missionary and special funds otherwise provided for) and pay all orders drawn on him by order of the board of managers. He shall keep an accurate book of accounts, and at the annual meeting shall lay before the church a statement of the moneys so received and paid out, which an auditing committee, appointed by the church, shall examine with the necessary vouchers.

Sec. 7. The clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the church in their meetings for business, of the board of managers and of any special committees. He shall be a member ex-officio of all committees of the church, shall take charge of all the records and keep a

register of all the members of the church.

Sec. 8. The financial secretary shall receive, count, and keep a record of all subscriptions and moneys paid into the church and shall turn them over to their proper treasurer. He shall issue orders on the treasurer for the payment of all moneys ordered by the board of managers.

Sec. 9. The missionary treasurer shall receive from the financial secretary all missionary collections and shall forward them promptly when due to their intended

destination.

Sec. 10. The music and organ manager shall have general oversight over the musical department of the church work and shall see that the organ is always kept in order.

Sec. 11. The supply manager shall order all supplies

required for the efficient running of the church.

Sec. 12. Two auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting to audit the books for the following year.

ARTICLE IV-Meetings

Sec. 1. The regular business meetings of the board of managers shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

Sec. 2. The annual business meeting of the church shall be held not later than the first Wednesday in January in each year.

Sec. 3. Special meetings may be called by the pastor,

or in his absence, the clerk shall call the meeting.

Sec. 4. Five male members of the board of managers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS

Art. 4. Sec. 4. Four male members of the board of managers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Jan. 5, 1910. No matter or matters of business (except that of members receiving the right-hand of fellowship) shall be brought up at the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. either preceding or following the ordinance; but shall be brought up and dealt with at a time other than mentioned.

Jan. 10, 1912. No member of this church shall be eligible for election to more than two offices at the same

time.

Whenever a tea is held in the church for the purpose of raising funds, the sum of one dollar must be paid to the sexton of the funds so raised.

All church collections must be counted by two members of the church before being taken away from the

church.

Amendment re Trustees-Jan. 12, 1916. "Whereas in our opinion it would be for the betterment of our church work to appoint our trustees for a term of three years.

"Therefore be it resolved that the trustees elected at this annual meeting shall respectively continue in office as follows:

"1. The first person elected shall continue in office for two years to be reckoned from the annual meeting next after his election, and thence until his successor has been elected.

"2. The second person elected shall continue in office one year, to be reckoned from the same period,

and until his successor has been appointed.

"3. The third person elected shall continue in office until the next ensuing annual meeting of the church or

until his successor has been appointed."

Jan. 7, 1919. Before a motion can be moved at the annual meeting altering the Constitution of the church, notice of the same must be posted on the church notice board at least three months previous to the annual business meeting.
